1. Write Your Story

Box 1: Your Memory (The Story)

Write 3-4 sentences about a memory, legacy, or person you want to honor. What did you see, hear, or feel?



Example: My grandfather always sat on the front porch in his blue sweater. He kept a pocket watch that ticked softly in the quiet afternoons.

2. Box 2: Your Anchor Phrase (The Repeating Line)

Write 1 short phrase (3-5 words) that feels like an anchor or repeating echo you want to hear again and again.



3. Create Your Poem Using an AI Helper

An AI helper (like ChatGPT, Claude, or Canva Magic Write) acts like a loom to weave your words into a poem.

Directions: Open your AI app. Copy the prompt below into the chat, replacing the brackets with your sentences from Box 1 and Box 2.



Turn my story into a 5-couplet Echo-Ghazal poem (5 two-line stanzas) using these rules:

- Anchor Phrase: End line 2 of every stanza with my exact anchor phrase from Box 2. (Also end 1 line of stanza 1 with it).
- Story Input: Weave my memories from Box 1 into the couplets.

Box 1 (My Memory): [Paste Box 1 text here]

Box 2 (My Anchor Phrase): [Paste Box 2 text here]

Keep my real words and feelings. Make it sound steady, lyrical, and honest. Do not add fake rhymes or fancy filler words.

4. Your Finished 10-Line Echo-Ghazal Poem

Example:

In my grandfather's blue sweater, I learned to listen in the quiet light
The pocket watch kept time beside him in the quiet light

His porch held stories the afternoon could softly keep
I heard his voice return to me in the quiet light

I carry his kindness through each doorway I enter
His steady hands remind me to breathe in the quiet light

Now I sit with the past and let it speak
I find my own next step in the quiet light
